Every Captive and Open access consumer(s)/ user(s) shall have to submit necessary details regarding total consumption of electricity and power purchase from Renewable Energy sources for fulfillment of RPPO on yearly basis on or before the 30 <sup>th</sup> April to the State Agency.			
6.	Effect of Default	<ol> <li>Where the obligated entity does not fulfill the renewable purchase obligation as provided in these regulations during any year and also does not purchase the certificates, the Commission may direct the obligated entity to deposit into a separate fund, to be created and maintained by such obligated entity, such amount as the Commission may determine on the basis of the shortfall in units of RPPO and the forbearance price decided by the Central Commission.</li> </ol>			

		2. The fund so created shall be utilised, as may be directed by the Commission partly for purchase of the certificates and partly for development of transmission/ sub transmission infrastructure for evacuation of power from generating stations based on renewable energy sources.
7.	Monitoring and Implementing	Implementation of renewable energy certificate mechanism as may be assigned by the Commission from time to time.
